A pony is a small horse.


Ponies are less than 58 inches tall when measured at the shoulder.

A boy donkey is called a jack. A girl donkey is called a jenny.






# A Baby Rabbit is called a BUNNY

until they are 10 days old.




### A Baby Pig is called a PIGLET

tin cans.






A boy is called a ram.
